Roman Emperor: You are the boss of everything everywhere! You have many assistants and slaves to do whatever you say. Everyone has to pay you money so that you can live in luxury.





Roman Soldiers: You work hard and are paid well, and you have a solid job, not always fighting, often just making sure the peasants and slaves work hard and pay their taxes to the emperor.

Pharisees & Herod's followers: You live in the villages and towns with the peasants but your education makes you feel superior to the workers. You are a bit bossy in your own village, but you still have to do



everything the Emperor and the Soldiers say.



Jesus the Peasant: You are free to move around and look for work wherever you can find it, but you will have to work hard when you can, because there won't always be work. Watch out for the

bossy soldiers – they will make you pay tax to the emperor.

**Slaves**: You always have work – but you won't get paid. Everyone is the boss of you! Your master is the boss of you, and will give you some food and a place to sleep – maybe.



But he demands you work hard doing whatever he says. The soldiers will also be bossy if they think you're getting out of hand.
